As part of a summer class on upcycling organized by the Münster School of Business (MSB) in August 2022, Prof. Beck hosted CampX. A sustainability camp where a group of national and international students camped for three days on a farmstead in Münsterland and worked on various mini-challenges on the topic of sustainability. Among other things, the students built a self-supporting bridge and a TLUD stove with which they cooked and made charcoal. The charcoal was later used in a homemade water filter. Water from a nearby pond was filtered with it and drunk as coffee in the morning. There were various lectures by invited guests: Prof. Dr. Lars Grabbe gave a lecture on dystopia in film at midnight in the middle of the dark forest – the whole after a dystopian film was projected in the forest. Among others, the water filter company What a Bird or the AI/robotics company Zauberzeug presented themselves.
